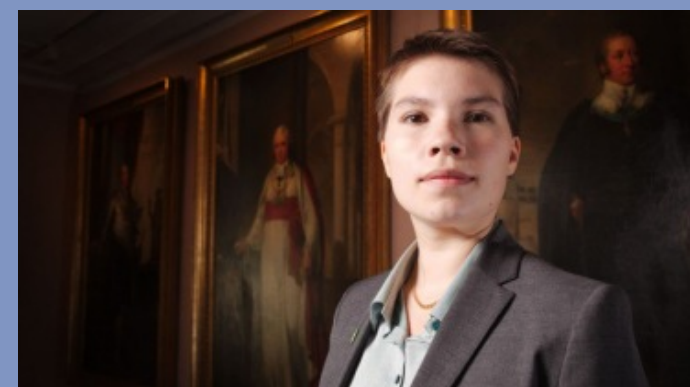

From war to lasting peace – the role of girls and women

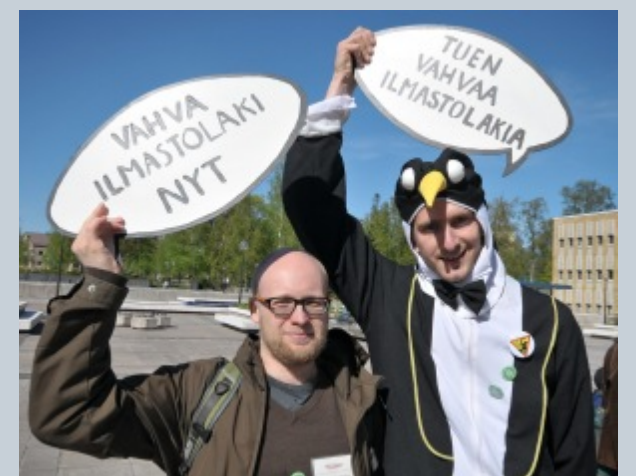

Radicalization of Youth: Preventing, Acting and Living Together

What does radicalization actually mean, and what causes it? Is radicalization a good or bad thing? How do we recognize it? When does radicalization lead to violence?

Radicalization is a big word that is familiar to many from images of terrorism and violent extremist movements in far-away places. Radicalization takes place everywhere and has taken many forms throughout history, also in our societies. Radicalization has been a force for positive change in societies but also been a driver for some of the darkest events in our history.

While radicalization into violent extremism is not confined to any age, sex, group or community, young people are particularly vulnerable to the messages of violent extremists and terrorist organizations.

We invite you to join us for a workshop where we explore different forms of radicalization and ways to recognize them.

Milla holds M.Soc.Sci in International Relations, Peace and Conflict studies. Currently she works with the programme design, coordination and facilitation of community engagement processes, inter-faith collaboration, and trust building between various religious communities and local and national authorities, NGOs and law enforcement in Finland. She coordinates two programmes that are part of Finland's National Action Plan for Preventing Violent Radicalization and extremism. which are part of strategic partnership framework of Finn Church Aid and the Network with the Ministry of the Interior of Finland. The goal of the work is to develop inclusive and community-based solutions for preventing violent radicalization and extremism.



Felix Unogwu

Felix is an expert in both preventing extremist groups from recruiting young people and to rehabilitate former child soldier. With his own background as an immigrant and searching for an identity in a new country, he had learn much of the problems by own experience! Felix was born in central Nigeria, in the zone between the Muslims in the North and the Christians in the South, by a Catholic mother and Muslim father. He has a M.Sc in Political Science and an advanced degree in Conflict Resolution in University of Massachusetts, Boston. In the Boston, Felix worked with coalition of groups to help institute Universal Health Care, a process that required lobbying several state Senators and including the Governor of the State Mitt Romney. In Washington, DC Felix worked with several groups to analyze and influence policies concerning the use of child soldiers around the world.
